Guidelines

Outstanding Individual Achievement Award

An outstanding individual who has distinguished themselves in promoting and celebrating multiculturalism, harmony and cultural diversity in South Australia for at least 10 years.

Arts and Culture Award

An individual or organisation that has made an outstanding contribution to promoting multiculturalism in the South Australian community through the arts or cultural activities.

Community Sector Awards

An employee or volunteer in a not-for-profit community organisation, or a not-for-profit community organisation or team within a broader organisation, who has worked to promote multiculturalism and improve community harmony.

Media Award

A journalist or media communicator who has demonstrated significant commitment or achievement in promoting multiculturalism and harmony, through traditional or new media, resulting in positive outcomes for the South Australian community.

Private Sector Award

A private sector business, team or employee who has provided outstanding services that recognise cultural diversity in the workplace and/or in the community. This may also include creating employment and training opportunities for and improving the economic status of people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

Public Sector Award

A local, state or federal government agency, unit, team or individual who has provided outstanding services that recognise, assist or promote cultural diversity in South Australia.

Volunteer Award

A volunteer with at least five years of service who has made an outstanding contribution to multiculturalism in the South Australian community.

Senior volunteer award

A volunteer who has contributed over 20 years of service to South Australia's multicultural community. The individual may be a volunteer in the not-for-profit, private or government sector.

Youth awards

An individual under 30 years of age, or a youth organisation or group of individuals under 30 years of age that has promoted multiculturalism and harmony in the South Australian community.

Celebrating outstanding South Australians who promote multiculturalism and increase understanding of the benefits of cultural diversity in our community.

Nomination Details

Unless otherwise stated, judging is based on an assessment of outstanding contribution in the 12 months leading up to 12 October 2018.

The nomination must include a supporting statement of up to 500 words that demonstrates the nominee's contributions and achievements in the selected category.

This statement should include:

- nominee's name and achievements (past and present)
- details of the nominee's contributions towards promoting multiculturalism and increasing understanding of cultural diversity in South Australia
- information about the positive impact of the nominee's efforts in the community
- the number of years the nominee has been engaged in relevant activities
- any other relevant achievements or evidence of public recognition
- a list of any other relevant current or previous positions held by the nominee
- proof of any publication/s, article/s, broadcast/s or other relevant media examples (media category only).
