First death in SA from COVID-19

Sadly, SA Health can confirm a 75-year-old man from metropolitan Adelaide passed away overnight from COVID-19 in the Royal Adelaide Hospital.

The man had recently travelled interstate.

Despite the best efforts of the medical professionals and staff and the love and support of his family he passed away.

The family have publicly implored all South Australians to abide by and comply with the advice and directions given by the government and police.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA COVID-19 CASES

There have been **4** new cases of COVID-19 today bringing the total to **415** confirmed cases in South Australia.

Cases linked to the Ruby Princess cruise ship has increased by **1**, to **86** cases.

There has also been **1** additional case linked to the Adelaide Airport

cluster, taking the total to **29** cases.

To date, **89** people have been confirmed cleared of COVID-19.
