Recovered cases in South Australia

In South Australia to date, 308 people have recovered from COVID-19. This represents 70 per cent of cases in the state.

Updates to essential traveller criteria

The <u>Direction</u> on cross border travel has been updated to include new information about essential travellers. It includes changes for Defence and military personnel, health services and FIFO workers, as well as people travelling to South Australia to visit a critically or terminally ill relative, or to attend the funeral of an immediate family member.

National update

Prime Minister Scott Morrison announced current baseline restrictions will remain in place for at least another four weeks.

Three benchmarks need to be in place before restrictions can be eased. These are a broader and more extensive testing regime, greater contact tracing capabilities using technology and a local response capability to contain localised outbreaks should they occur.
