COVID-19 UPDATE 2: FRIDAY 20 MARCH 2020

A multi-agency COVID-19 Command Centre within SA Health headquarters was launched today as part of the State Government's coordinated whole-of-government plan and response to the coronavirus pandemic.

The new COVID-19 Command Centre includes representatives from key agencies including SAPOL, South Australian Metropolitan Fire Service and South Australian Ambulance Service working together to enable a comprehensive state-wide response, including the rapid planning and coordination of resources.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA COVID-19 CASES

Since 1 February 2020, there have been 50 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in South Australia.

All cases can be traced to direct have overseas travel, interstate travel or confirmed contact of a known case. There is no evidence of any community transmission within South Australia.
